Conference news & notes

- HHC play began last week with four teams going 1-0. Three teams – New Palestine, Pendleton Heights and Shelbyville – remain unbeaten. PH is 3-0 for the first time since 2014. Shelbyville is 3-0 for the third straight year. NP is 3-0 for the fifth straight season.
- New Palestine host Mt. Vernon in the Helmet game this week. The teams' traveling trophy, the Boundary Rail, is also up for grabs. Delta and Yorktown will also meet in an intra-county rivalry game.
- Greenfield-Central beat Mt. Vernon 27-0 to post its first shutout in a conference game since 2011, when the Cougars also beat Mt. Vernon 6-0. QB Andrew Leslie threw for 224 yards and two touchdowns, and also ran for a score. Mike Hoskins had 113 receiving yards and a TD.
- New Palestine won its 28th straight HHC game with a 43-0 shutout of Yorktown. Zach Neligh ran for 175 yards and a score and threw for 200 and a TD. Colby Jenkins had 129 receiving yards and a TD.
- Pendleton Heights and New Castle had a back-and-forth game the Arabians won on a late score 34-31. Evan Douglas had led PH with 217 yards and three TDs rushing, as well as two INTs on defense. NC's Niah Williamson threw for 345 yards, 115 to Triston Chesher.
- Shelbyville got a late TD from Damon Lux to beat Delta 28-21. Lux ran for 159 yards and three TDs for the Golden Bears, and had 14 tackles and a pick on defense. Delta's Charlie Spegal posted his third straight 200-yard game with 286 yards and three TDs.

Offense: Zach Neligh, New Palestine

Neligh had a strong all-around day, with 200 passing yards and 175 rushing yards in the Dragons' 43-0 win over Yorktown. He also ran for and passed for a touchdown.

Defense: Turk Fajtele, Greenfield-Central

Fajtele had 13 tackles and a forced fumble in the Cougars' 27-0 shutout of Mt. Vernon.

Special Teams: Braden Brown, Greenfield-Central

Brown averaged 46 yards per punt, with a long of 57. Two of his five boots landed inside the 20 in G-C's 27-0 win.
